Kentucky OVR has entered an Order of Selection, what does this mean for me?

- If you are already a consumer of OVR services and have a signed IPE (Individualized Plan for Employment) nothing changes, and you will continue to receive services.
- If you are not sure if you have a signed IPE, please contact your OVR Counselor and ask.
- If you are a consumer of OVR services and do not yet have a signed IPE, you will be put on a waiting list.
- If you have not yet applied to OVR but want help finding a job, you can still apply for services. They will determine eligibility and assign you to a priority category.
- You will be put on a waiting list, according to your Priority Category and the date you were determined eligible for OVR services.
- OVR states they will serve people off the waiting list, starting with Category 1 and according to the date of eligibility, as funds allow.
- If you are put on an OVR waiting list, what are the options?
 - The OVR Counselor will share a list of resources that could be helpful to you in finding supports. OVR is not the only way to get help with employment.
 - If you have a Medicaid waiver, those funds can be used to pay for supported employment services. Contact your provider or <u>DDID.SupportedEmployment@ky.gov</u> for questions about this process.
 - If you have money in an ABLE account or availability to private pay, you can ask the employment provider agency about using those funds to pay for supported employment services.
